

Selection Guidelines to host an International Renewable Energy Conference (IREC)

History

Initiated at the renewables2004 conference in Bonn, the International Renewable Energy Conference (IREC) is a high-level political conference series dedicated to renewable energy policy worldwide. Focusing exclusively on the renewable energy sector, the IREC is hosted by a government biennially and convened by REN21.

What the IREC Aims to Achieve

The IREC is a common multi-stakeholder platform for government, private sector and civil society leaders to jointly address the goal of advancing renewable energy. It is international in scope and thus is expected to be wide reaching in terms of the content and participation.

Purpose of the event

The IREC brings together an audience who embraces collectively the overarching principle that renewables play a central role for a sustainable, clean and healthy environment. The IREC offers participants a unique opportunity to dialogue on the advancement of renewable energy and positions the discussion on the triad of people, planet and profit. Discussions are centred on cross-cutting themes of the power, transport, heating and cooling end-use sectors.

Selection Criteria

Legal

- The “host” is defined as a national government or a legal entity that represents the national government
- The host country is a member of REN21¹

Finance

- The host will secure financial underwriting to host the IREC, including a minimum of €250,000 for REN21 Secretariat support²

Operations and outreach

- Ability/willingness of the host to exercise regional leadership
- Willingness/capability of the host to attract political leaders from the region and globally to the conference
- Willingness/capability to work with and attract civil society organisations
- Commitment to involve regional and international media

Infrastructure

- Conference venue has the necessary infrastructure to accommodate a 1,500-2,000-person conference;
- The venue is in the vicinity of a central airport hub
- The host and /or host country can assist with a simplified visa process to support inclusive participation, i.e. international attendance

Commitments

- The host has taken concrete action to promote a renewable energy agenda at the national level
- The host ensures national level political support for hosting the IREC
- The host will secure the participation of all sectors: government, industry, civil society, academia, etc., and is diverse, e.g. industrialised and developing countries, women and men, youth leaders.

Other criteria

- A national election cycle is not anticipated during the two-year IREC planning process
- The proposed IREC is not on the same continent as the immediately preceding IREC (see list above)

Application Process

The application process has **four steps**:

1) Publishing of Request for Proposals (RFP)

A RFP to host an IREC will be made available on REN21's website September 2020.

2) Submission of Proposal

The interested applicant is required to submit a proposal called the *conference bid document*. This document should be no more than 10 pages in length and should respond to the criteria outlined above. It is important that the *conference bid document* also outline ideas for the main themes programme, highlight the role of the host in advancing renewable energy and give a proposed outline for overall organisation between the host and REN21 (refer to IREC Host Guidelines for division of responsibilities).

It is not necessary to submit a detailed programme or conference venue floor plans when preparing the conference bid document.

The completed proposal must be submitted to the REN21 Secretariat by 31 January 2021.

3) Evaluation of Proposal

All *conference bid documents* will be assessed against the criteria, ranked and evaluated by the Secretariat and REN21 Bureau. The top three, short-listed applicants will be invited to present their proposal. Short-listed candidates will be informed via email by end-February 2021.

4) Presentation of Proposal

Short-listed applicants will be invited to “pitch”³ their proposal via a (virtual) REN21 Steering Committee meeting end March or early April 2021. Committee members will be invited to ask questions. Depending on the Committee’s assessment a scoping call or mission may be carried out before the final decision is made.

Final Decision

The final decision for selection of the IREC host is based on the following distribution:

- How well the conference bid document meets the defined criteria 50%
- Quality and clarity of conference bid document 25%
- Presentation and responses 25%

The successful applicant will be notified by email.
